Calling all food loss fighters! FoodE project is on the move!

Following its kick-off this April, project partners have conducted deep search to get down to the root of the food loss issue.


Starting from in depth researching and recording the specific issue, through scientific references and resources, scientific articles as well as through international organizations which are dedicated to resolve the food loss issue such as the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) the consortium gathered all necessary information to provide a deeper understanding of farm-stage food loss.

Through this thorough **research**, the project partners gained a deep understanding of growers' decision-making processes leading to the loss of edible produce left in the field and the following steps along the agri-food value chain. This research focused also on compiling national best practices that will help to address the food loss problem.

Subsequently, the **FoodE team**, conducted field research and interviews with experts from the agriculture and food industry i.e., Farmers, food scientists, agriculture researchers, consulting companies in the agri-food sector to identify the reasons that cause food loss and the possible solutions to minimize the problem. Through these field research and interviews, a better and deeper understanding on farmers' decision-making and perceptions on food loss was established, setting the base for the extrapolating the necessary 'innovation mix' with ways to tackle it.

Stakeholders' opinion:

Overall, all stakeholders had in common the fact that they suggested that preventing food loss requires a combination of preventive measures. This includes improving equipment and harvesting techniques and educating stakeholders about the environmental and financial impact of food loss. They also emphasize the importance of generating specialized data on food loss at the local, national, and EU levels to address this issue effectively. They believe that partnerships and associations among cultivators could play a critical role in improving the overall picture of cultivation, including reducing food loss.





FoodE e-Manual








FoodE Practice & Innovation Days
